Farm Share Program NOFA-VT

Our farm participates in the Vermont Farm Share Program. This program subsidizes CSA shares for our neighbors who otherwise could not afford to join our CSA.

Through the program, NOFA-VT will match every dollar that our CSA raises to offer reduced rates to income eligible individuals and families.

Your contributions are tax-deductible if you make checks payable to NOFA-VT.



I would like to contribute to the Vermont Farm Share Program to help low-income households in our community join the farm. Every cent donated goes directly towards the cost of a share, and any size donation helps.

Winter CSA Shares

Shares are picked up weekly November and December (9 weeks).

Shares are picked up at our farm in East Dummerston on Wednesdays from 2 pm to 6pm.

In the event of weather, we will have to evaluate the situation and let folks know if a snow date pick up is an option.

Produce shares contain our own certified organic greens, storage crops, fruits and apple cider, plus our own frozen fruits and veggies.

Shares will be self-packaged and – *when possible* – all or partly free choice.

Single produce shares ('half shares') (\$200) are designed for a couple or small family.

Double produce shares ('full shares') (\$400) are typically enough for a family of 4 or so.

The Add On option (\$90) includes weekly additions of value-added products—our applesauce, dill pickles, raw cider vinegar, fresh organic pie (1x), fresh organic bread and fruit jam (4x), and maple syrup.

Sample Shares

Mid November Single Produce Share

1 bunch kale or chard
1 bunch tender mizuna- for cooking or salad
1 lb. beets
1 quart Brussels sprouts
2 delicata squash
2 heads garlic
1 lb. carrots
½ peck Macoun apples
1 ½ lb. Bosc pears

Mid December Single Produce Share

½ lb. salad mix or 1 head bok choy
1 lb. spinach
1 lb. onions
1 ½ lb. potatoes
2 acorn squash
½ peck Fuji or Empire apples
½ gallon apple cider
1 lb. frozen peaches or blueberries
1 lb. frozen beans or 1 pkg. frozen sweet corn

Early Winter Produce

Our offerings for shares this period tend heavily toward our staples: potatoes, fruits, fresh greens from the greenhouses and field, and squash. We have enough other stuff to keep the mix lively, but in the spirit of full disclosure there will be no celeriac, rutabagas, or parsnips. The absentee status of the rutabagas and parsnips is regrettable; the celeriac...not as sad about. Beets and carrots will be present but not overwhelming, and we plan to buy local organic onions to make up for our crop's size.

Fruits and vegetables are 100% certified organic. Shares may include, but are not limited to, a variety of squash, a variety of potatoes, spinach, lettuce, Asian braising greens, beet greens, bok choy, mizuna, radishes, kales, chard, beets, carrots, cabbage, Brussels sprouts, garlic, onions, frozen green beans and sweet corn. Fruits include Bosc pears, and apples such as Macoun, Cortland, Empire, Honeycrisp, and frozen blueberries and peaches.

What else?

There are no meat shares running during the winter period. Organic pastured chicken is **SOLD OUT** until next summer, and we will sell organic pastured pork as long as supplies last through the early fall. More pork will become available sometime during the winter.
